April Saints

April 1st

The feast of St. Hugh of Grenoble. He was a Benedictine and later Bishop of Grenoble, despite his humility and not wanting to be elevated to that title. St. Hugh was patron and benefactor of St. Bruno, founder of the Carthusian Order.

April 2nd

The feast of St. Francis of Paola. He was the founder of the Order of the Hermits of St. Francis, called the Minims, which means the *Least*. He died on Good Friday when he was 91 years old and canonized 12 years after his death.

April 3rd

The feast of St. Benedict the African. His parents, Christopher and Diana, were slaves who had been taken from Africa to Sicily. Scorned and mocked by others due to his origin and skin, he retained a natural cheerfulness. Benedict gave away what little he had and joined the Franciscan hermits near Palermo.

April 4th

The feast of St. Isidore of Seville. He was a bishop and Doctor of the Universal Church whose three brothers were also saints. St. Isidore succeeded his brother, St. Leander, as Bishop of Seville and ruled there for forty years.

April 5th

The feast of St. Vincent Ferrer, one of the greatest saints of the Dominican Order. He had the gift of tongues, speaking in his own language, others understood him in theirs. St. Vincent raised 40 persons from the dead, cured thousands of the blind, lame, deaf and dumb. Because he worked so hard to build up the Church and end the Western Schism, St. Vincent is the patron of builders and construction workers.

Our Lady of the New Millennium (The Shrine was selected as the permanent home for Our Lady of the Millennium.)






Divine Mercy Sunday - The Sunday after Easter

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Sunday after [Easter](#), the [Octave of Easter](#), observed by [Roman Catholic](#), as well as some [Anglicans](#). It is originally based on the [Catholic devotion](#) to the [Divine Mercy](#) that Saint [Faustina Kowalska](#) reported as part of her encounter with Jesus, and is associated with special promises from Jesus and [indulgences](#) issued by the Church.

The feast of [Divine Mercy](#), as recorded in the diary of Saint Faustina, receives from Jesus Himself the biggest promises of Grace related to the Devotion of Divine Mercy. In specific, Jesus states that the soul that goes to [Sacramental Confession](#) (the confession may take place some days before), and receives Holy [Eucharistic Communion](#) on that day, shall obtain the total forgiveness of all sins and punishment. That means each person would go immediately after [death](#) to the [heaven](#), without suffering in [purgatory](#) (or [hell](#)). Additionally, the Roman Catholic Church grants a plenary indulgence (observing the usual rules) with the recitation of some simple prayers.


Chaplet of Divine Mercy

The [Chaplet of the Divine Mercy](#) is a Christian devotion, based on the visions of [Jesus](#) reported by [Saint Mary Faustina Kowalska](#) (1905-1938), known as "*the Apostle of Mercy*." She was a [Polish sister](#) of the [Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy](#) and [canonized](#) as a Catholic saint in 2000.

Faustina stated that she received the prayer through visions and conversations with Jesus, who made specific promises regarding the recitation of the prayers. Her Vatican biography quotes some of these conversations.

As a [Roman Catholic devotion](#), the [chaplet](#) is often said as a [rosary-based prayer](#) with the same set of [rosary](#) beads used for reciting the Holy Rosary or the [Chaplet of Holy Wounds](#), in the Roman Catholic Church. As an [Anglican devotion](#), The Divine Mercy Society of the Anglican Church states that the chaplet can also be recited on [Anglican prayer beads](#). The chaplet may also be said without beads, usually by counting prayers on the fingertips, and may be accompanied by the veneration of the [Divine Mercy image](#).

In an effort to make notification of an emergency school closing as efficient and quick as possible, Noonan Elementary Academy has adopted an automatic calling system. In case of a school closing, our “phone blast” will start and all our families will be called simultaneously. In addition to the phone blast, you may also check the following:

1. Listen to WGN radio (AM – 720) or WBBM radio (AM – 780) between 6:30 and 8:00 A.M. or watch CBS-TV (2), NBC-TV (5), ABC-TV (7), WGN-TV (9), or FOX-TV, for closing information.
2. Go to the public website at www.emergencyclosings.com and search for the facility by typing the name and city of the facility.
3. Check the internet for your local news and school closings.
4. You should receive a phone call (home number) regarding closings. The phone call goes to the home phone number you have on file at school. If you want it to go to a cell number, you must use your cell number as your home phone number. Please update your phone number when changes take place.

Registering for this prayer event is easy and quick, and it can be done by going to:



Communion on the Tongue

It is a tradition at the Academy for the children to receive communion on their tongue. The church permits the faithful to receive communion on the tongue or in the hand. Both are valid; both are acceptable.

The Academy has chosen to promote Communion on the tongue in an effort to develop and reinforce a deep reverence and respect for the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is 100% Catholic. It is a wonderful mystery, an awesome gift from God, and one of the central dogmas of our faith.

Jesus tells us in John 6:35, “I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in me shall never thirst,” and again in John 6:48 Jesus says, “I am the bread of life. Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness and they died. This is the bread which comes down from heaven, which a man may eat of it and not die.”

In John 6:51 “I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh.”

At this point, many of the followers of Jesus began to murmur and grumble since they could not imagine how they could eat his flesh. Jesus once again, repeats this teaching when he says in John 6:54 “He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me and I in him.”

After this, many of the disciples left. Jesus made no attempt to stop them. He didn’t say, I am only speaking symbolically. Nor did he say I was only kidding. Their faith, even after witnessing the many miracles Jesus performed and hearing many of his sermons, wasn’t strong enough to believe in this, the greatest of miracles.

In John 6:68 Jesus asks the twelve apostles if they would leave too and Peter, the leader, answers, “Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life and we have believed, and come to know, that you are the Holy One of God.”

The apostles didn’t understand how Jesus could give them his flesh to eat and his blood to drink either but they believed in him. Their faith was strong.

St. Baldrick's Foundation Ishaan Patel

Ishaan Patel is a current 7th grader in Mrs. Eminger's class. For the past five years, Ishaan Patel has raised money for the St. Baldrick's Foundation by shaving his head. To date, he has raised over \$1000 to help the St. Baldrick's Foundation fund research to find a cure for childhood cancers and support local families that have kids with cancer. Ishaan got involved with this organization through his Taekwondo school, Frankfort Black Belt Academy/ Polaris Martial Arts. One of his instructors, Mrs. Vicki Truesdale, organizes a fundraiser every March for St. Baldrick's and this is where Ishaan shaves his head annually.



The St. Baldrick's Foundation is a not-for-profit organization with the aim of raising funds to help find cures for children with cancer.

The name of the foundation is not associated with a recognized Saint of the Catholic Church, but is founded on word play and appropriation of the title of sainthood. Volunteers sponsored by family, friends, and employers shave their heads or "chop" their ponytails in solidarity with children who typically lose their hair during cancer treatment in order to raise funds.



Physicals, Immunizations, and Dental Information

In order to be state compliant, all of our students need to be up to date with their physical, immunizations, eye, and dental examination by the first day of school. All exam forms can be downloaded from our website <http://www.noonanacademy.org/forms-policies>

~ Physicals and Immunizations – Due October 15th

Students entering preschool, kindergarten, and sixth grade, in the fall, are required to have an updated physical and updated immunizations.

- † Physical / Immunization Form (yellow form) – is available in the main office.
- † The physical exam must be performed within one year prior to the first day of school.

~ Dental Examination – Due May 15th of kind., 2nd, & 6th grades

Students entering kindergarten, second, and sixth grade, in the fall, are required to have an updated dental examination.

- † The Dental Examination Form (yellow form) – is available in the main office.
- † The dental exam must be completed within 18 months of the May 15th deadline.

~ Eye Examination – Due October 15th

Students entering kindergarten in the fall and all kindergarten - 8th grade transfer students are required to have an updated eye examination.

- † The Eye Examination Form (yellow form) – is available in the main office.
- † The eye exam must be performed within one year prior to the first day of school.

- † Physical examination
- † 4th DPT shot

- † Dental examination
- † Eye examination

~ Second Grade Requirements

- † Dental examination

~ Sixth Grade Requirements

- † Physical examination
- † One dose Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis)
- † Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine (on or after 11th birthday)
- † Dental examination

Tornado Safety Rules

A TORNADO WATCH

Means that conditions are right for severe thunderstorms and possible tornados to develop.

A TORNADO WARNING

Means that a tornado has been sighted and detected by radar. Take cover immediately.

SAFETY RULES - IN OPEN COUNTRY

- † Never take shelter in an automobile. Go quickly to the nearest shelter.
- † Move away from the tornado's path at a right angle.
- † If there is no time to escape, go to the nearest ditch or ravine and lie face down, with your knees drawn up under you. Cover the back of your head with your hands.

SAFETY RULES - IN SCHOOL

- † Follow instructions for that school.
- † Go quickly to an inside hallway on the lowest floor.
- † Avoid seeking shelter in the gymnasium or auditorium.
- † If there is time, draw curtains or blinds to lessen the danger of flying glass.
- † Students must not board school buses during a tornado warning. Wait until the danger has passed and an all-clear signal is given.

SAFETY RULES - AT HOME OR IN ANY HOUSE

- † If possible, go to a corner of the basement, away from windows for maximum safety.
- † If there is no basement, take cover in an interior hallway, closet or under heavy furniture in the center part of the house.
- † Open some windows, but then get away from them.
- † If possible, take a transistor radio with you to listen to your local radio station for weather reports.
- † Remain under cover until an all-clear signal has been given.

SAFETY RULES - IN ANY OTHER BUILDING

Hotel, Motel, Department Store, Apartment, Hi Rise, Business Office, Factory, Plant, Hospital, Clinic

- † Go to pre-designated shelter areas or to an interior hallway on the lowest floor, preferably the basement.
- † Stay away from windows, doors, and outside walls.

SAFETY RULES - AFTER THE TORNADO HAS PASSED

Look out for and use caution around

- ✓ Fallen electric wires
- ✓ Open flames or fires
- ✓ Fallen trees or utility poles
- ✓ Damaged or weakened buildings
- ✓ Traffic lights not working
- ✓ Polluted drinking water
- ✓ Broken glass and nails
- ✓ Gas leaks and oil spills
- ✓ Flooding
- ✓ Looters


